It provides graduate and post-graduate training programmes for both Hungarian and international students in the field of Hungarian music pedagogy and methodology based on Zoltán Kodály's music pedagogical concept.

The Institute is determined to safeguard all the values of Hungarian music teaching methodology developed according to Kodály's original intentions while constantly adapting Kodály's ideas to today's world – to both opportunities and challenges.

BA IN GENERAL MUSIC STUDIES WITH KODÁLY EMPHASIS IN ENGLISH (3 YEARS)

A three-year, 180 credit graduate course in musicianship with Kodály emphasis for those who wish to receive thorough music training before entering an MA course.

Deadline for applications is February each year.

MA IN KODÁLY MUSIC PEDAGOGY IN ENGLISH (1 YEAR)

This comprehensive study programme gives authentic background and all-encompassing scientific knowledge about the world-famous educational philosophy of Zoltán Kodály.

The one-year degree course contains 60 graduate credits.

The academic year commences in September and extends to end of June of the following year.

Deadline for applications is usually in the middle of February.

POST-GRADUATE COURSES IN ENGLISH (1 YEAR)

The Institute also organizes *one-year non-degree courses* for teaching music and training musicians based on the Kodály concept of music pedagogy both in theory and in practice.

These courses are offered for music pedagogues, choral conductors, singers and pianists: music pedagogy, choral conducting, piano, voice, lied accompaniment.

The academic year commences in September and extends to end of May of the following year.

Deadline for applications is March 1 each year.
